FindKnowDo Regulatory Calendar Feeds

FindKnowDo tracks important regulatory event dates for several federal agencies and private SROs. You can view them at any time at https://www.findknowdo.com/events. Many people, however, will prefer to import FindKnowDo regulatory event dates into their own calendar, e.g. Microsoft Outlook. The advantage to doing so is that your FindKnowDo subscription entitles you to real-time updates, also known as "feeds", as we publish them. Powerful calendaring apps such as Outlook will automatically pull down these updates within a refresh window, typically a couple of hours, keeping you instantly abreast of changes as the FindKnowDo professionals publish them.

Instructions for Microsoft Outlook users

In Outlook, go to Tools > Options > Account Settings

If you don't see a Tools menu item, try: File > Info > Account Settings > Account Settings:

Then click **Add**. Note: calendars are only available to FindKnowDo subscribers, so you need to be logged into FindKnowDo in Internet Explorer (which Outlook uses for web connections). If you aren't presently logged into the FindKnowDo you'll get an error message such as:



If so, simply use Internet Explorer to log into FindKnowDo first, then try again in Outlook.
